Supply List for Art Smarts Summer Art Classes @ MTRP

Thank you for registering for our Summer Classes @MTRP!

Below is a "suggested" list for art supplies for the classes being held. Students are welcome to choose media as they wish for the classes. Please <u>Note: OIL PAINTS are not allowed in this venue.</u>

The <u>"Must Have's"</u> for the lessons in 1&2 Point Perspective are highlighted. The size of the paper on which you work in is your choice. Any size from 9"x12" to 18" x 24" or anything in between can be used. Which ever size suits you best.

If a student prefers to work in water colors or oil crayons, or even Aqua Crayons or Aqua Pencils, in the "Landscape Painting Class" that is perfectly fine. I can direct students in various media. Please let me know ahead of time so I can help you with what to bring. For working in Acrylic Paint, if you don't already have paints, I HIGHLY recommend the "Grumbacher Acrylic Starter Kit". It is available at Michaels Arts and Crafts. It has the brushes you need and it has some primed canvas boards for painting on. With a Michaels coupon, (and they usually have one for 40% to 50% off one item) it is beyond affordable. Here is the Michaels link:

In class I will teach you how to mix the colors from the tubes in the kit. If you already have acrylic paints bring those instead, along with brushes, a primed stretched canvas and something to use as a palette to mix your colors on. I use Reynolds Freezer Wrap Paper. It's very economical! Palette paper at the art stores cost alot more per foot of paper. Also bring either a sturdy plastic plate to rest the palette paper on or a disposable plastic food container alone is fine too.

If you have never painted in Acrylics before and simply want to try it out for one class please contact me.
